ABOUT THE COURSE

This qualification reflects the role of community services workers involved in the delivery, management and coordination of person-centred services to individuals, groups, and communities.

At this level, workers have specialised skills in community services and work autonomously within their scope of practice under broad directions from senior management.

Workers support people to make change in their lives to improve personal and social wellbeing and may also have responsibility for the supervision of other workers and volunteers. They may also undertake case management and program coordination.

To achieve this qualification, the candidate must have completed at least 100 hours of work as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of units of competency.

Entry requirements	There are no training package entry requirements. AIA has the following entry requirements for the international students: A learner must: ▪ Be at least 18 years of age. ▪ Have completed at least the equivalent of year 12 education. ▪ Participate in a course entry interview to determine suitability for the course and student needs. ▪ Participate in an LLN (Language, Literacy and Numeracy) assessment*, if applicable, to determine and demonstrate their readiness and learning capacity to undertake their desired course. ▪ Applicants must demonstrate one of the approved forms of English proficiency. For Student visa (Subclass 500) requirements, the Australian Government increased the minimum English-language threshold to an overall IELTS score of 6.0, with no band below 5.5, and results must be from a test taken within the past one (1) year. English language competence may also be satisfied through documented evidence of any of the following: • The applicant has completed at least five (5) years of education in an English-speaking country. (Accepted as proof of English competency across visa categories.) • The applicant has undertaken a minimum of six (6) months of study at AQF Level 4 or above in an Australian Registered Training Organisation (RTO) within the last two (2) years. (Consistent with pathways accepted as alternate evidence of English ability across the Australian immigration framework.) • the student has successfully completed an English Placement Test at AIA. <i>* For detail about LLN requirements and assessment process, please refer to the 'LLN (Language, Literacy and Numeracy) Requirements' section below.</i> ▪ <i>** Note that other English language tests such as PTE and TOEFL can be accepted. In that case, students are required to provide their results so that it can be confirmed they are equivalent to minimum IELTS score of 6.0 or higher</i>
